Clinical Support	Nursing Care	Providing you clinical care, treatment, therapy, and intervention 1. Registered nurse clinical care - Providing specialised clinical nursing care, such as assessments and administering medicine. 2. Enrolled nurse clinical care - Providing clinical nursing care, such as managing wounds and monitoring pulse, blood pressure, etc., 3. Nursing assistant clinical care - Providing clinical nursing care under a nurse's supervision, and
		4. Nursing care consumables - Specialised nursing products such as prescribed skin emollients that would not ordinarily be carried by a nurse.
	Allied Health Services	Healthcare professionals who prevent, diagnose, treat, and rehabilitate people such as podiatrists and physiotherapists, including 1. Physiotherapy, 2. Podiatry, 3. Social work, 4. Speech pathology, 5. Exercise physiology, 6. Occupational therapy, 7. Psychology, 8. Allied health assistance, 9. Music therapy, 10. Counselling or psychotherapy, and 11. Diet or nutrition.
	Care Management	Help making, co-ordinating, and reviewing your ongoing care plan, including ongoing care needs, goals, preferences and budget.

Independence	Personal Care	Services if you need help with bathing, hygiene, dressing, mobility, and communication, including 1. Assistance with self-administration of medications - help to take medication independently, e.g., arranging pharmacist-prepared Webster packs, 2. Assistance with self-care and activities of daily living - help with showering, self-care, hygiene, brushing hair, cleaning teeth and shaving, and 3. Domestic life products - Sourcing and supply of prescribed equipment, such as non-slip plates and touch lights, 4. Managing body functions - Sourcing and supply of prescribed equipment such as compression garments and reaching devices, 5.
